Green Action in Sheffield

The Green Party group on Sheffield City Council has:

- Successfully campaigned for powers to bring back Bus Regulation in South Yorkshire.
- Initiated the campaign for bus services now available on Boxing Day and New Year's Day.
- Proposed the new night time noise nuisance service.
- Helped fund the South Yorkshire Energy Centre offering energy saving advice.
- Ensured Sheffield was the first city to opt into the Sustainable Communities Act.
- Increased Council help for small businesses by settling bills quicker and advertising reduced business rates.

A GREEN VOTE IS FOR

X BETTER PUBLIC TRANSPORT

To tackle traffic congestion, air pollution and road danger we would prioritise walking, cycling and public transport. Most people in Walkley have good access to bus services such as the 52, 95 and 123 routes but these need to be protected. We want cheaper, Council controlled bus services, more local rail stations and a rail network back in public ownership. We want better road safety including a 20mph limit on residential roads (excluding major routes).

BETTER HOUSING AND LOWER BILLS

We believe everyone has the right to housing that is safe, warm, dry and affordable. We would build more affordable housing and make the council's Lettings Policy clearer and fairer. We would better insulate all housing, offer more energy saving advice and loans for the installation of money-saving solar panels. Some Walkley residents are benefiting from the free Council insulation scheme but it must be more flexible and extended to hard to treat homes so that everyone benefits.



We oppose the privatisation of NHS, council and other public services. We believe private firms cost more and offer a poorer service and less democratic control. We oppose Private Finance deals such as PFI which lock public bodies into long term contracts lasting decades. We would invest in a Green economy creating jobs and training in public transport, renewable energy and food production We would bring in a 'Living Wage' and reduce the gap between the best and worst paid.

X STRONGER COMMUNITIES

We believe good local services are the building blocks of strong, safe communities. We would protect and improve the Post Office network. We support local, independent businesses over


corporate giants which often damage the local economy. The new Tesco application on Commonside threatens South Road shopping parade. Trade at Hillsborough Shopping Centre is increasingly threatened by nearby big supermarkets.

Fir Street community centre is the kind of vibrant local resource, run by volunteers, that makes a big difference to people's lives. We support local community groups to get the services they need and make our streets cleaner and safer. We want more support for schools and youth facilities.
