Caroline Lucas argues forcefully for an alternative to the coalition government's savage cuts

She says, "The ConLibs claim that there is no alternative to savage cuts but Greens say there is an easier and better way.

"If we scrap expensive and irrelevant projects like Trident nuclear missiles, transfer money from road building to public transport and get tough on tax avoidance and evasion, we could afford a major public investment programme that would create hundreds of thousands of jobs while transforming the economy to help tackle climate change.

"What this government should be doing is things like tackling tax evasion and tax avoidance in a serious way, and use that money for investment, for example, in energy efficiency and renewable energies.

"This is the best way to get people back to work. it would also address the issue of climate change, getting our emissions down. There is an environmental crisis, there is an economic crisis: we can tackle them both at the same time."

"Get moving on Renewable Energy!" - Greens say to Council

Two Green Party council motions have forced the council to draw up a costed plan plan by December to take advantage of new Government green energy incentives before they are reduced in 2012.

The Feed-in Tariffs and Renewable Heat Incentive schemes could allow Broomhill people to be rewarded for generating their own electricity from renewable or low carbon sources such as solar electricity, thermal panels or wind turbines.

Jillian Creasy says: "We need to get a scheme up and running in 2011 with major installations ready by 2012, or Sheffield will miss out on potential funding. The Council could generate clean energy on council or privately owned buildings, and the energy cost savings or earnings would come back to the council and householders. These schemes could potentially make a lot of money for the council and its citizens, reduce fuel poverty and create jobs."
