The Coalition Government are planning major changes to our Health Service. A wave of cuts has been announced across the country and private companies are queuing up to profit from our health and ill health.

This meeting on May 3rd is a chance for everyone concerned about the NHS to discuss how we in Sheffield will work against the government proposals.

WE DON'T HAVE TO ACCEPT THESE HEALTH REFORMS

Nobody wants the new Bill except the people who will profit from it. The BMA, the RCN, the Royal College of General Practitioners and the major trade unions representing NHS workers all oppose it.

Lansley says: "I'm sorry I haven't explained it properly."

We say: "The more you dig, the deeper the hole."

Public opposition has forced the coalition into 'listening mode' but nothing has really changed yet. If this Bill goes through, even with cosmetic changes, **64% or more of frontline NHS services are at risk of being made subject to competition and privatised.** Private health services have already been charging 10% higher than NHS costs. If things go wrong, they can walk away pocketing any profits, leaving patients in the lurch and relying on the public sector to pick up the pieces.

WE DON'T HAVE TO ACCEPT THESE CUTS

Everyone in the NHS knows that cuts are slicing through services. First to go are clinical "non-essentials", often the very parts of the service which patients need to access treatment or help it be effective. Then the jobs go (560 ambulance workers in London).

In Sheffield 2 homes for people with dementia are scheduled for closure. There will be at least £37m managed cuts this year both in community services and in the hospitals. Staff everywhere are under huge pressure because of savings already being made.
