THE GREEN ALTERNATIVE

 A FAIR DEAL	 GREEN councillors represent local residents on traffic, parking, crime, planning and licensing issues which affect communities in and around the city centre.	 LABOUR intend to make a profit from Permit Parking Zones and are doubling prices. They have also cut council support for the police to help tackle antisocial behaviour.
 JOBS NOT CUTS	 GREENS would invest in infrastructure and small businesses to create jobs. We would reduce the deficit by taxing the very wealthy and closing tax loopholes.	 LABOUR failed to regulate the banks. They say they would make similar cuts to the CONSERVATIVE & LIB DEM coalition.
 NO MORE PRIVATISATION	 GREENS opposed from the start plans to privatise the NHS, Sheffield's costly waste contract with Veolia and the council's 25 year, £2 billion, Highways PFI contract.	 LABOUR and the LIB DEMS have wasted millions on privatisation schemes. LABOUR started the sell-off of NHS services. LIB DEMS support more NHS privatisation.
 SCRAP TUITION FEES	 GREENS have consistently campaigned against tuition fees and opposed academies.	 LABOUR first introduced tuition fees and the LIB DEMS broke their pledge not to increase them. Both have let schools in Sheffield opt out and become academies.
 SAFE ENERGY	 GREENS invest in energy saving and renewable energy. We oppose expensive nuclear power and wars for oil.	 LABOUR took us to war and planned new nuclear power stations. The LIB DEMS have slashed investment in solar energy and agreed to allow new nuclear power.

GREEN ACTION



Cllr Rob Murphy and Cllr Jillian Creasy (*above*) have made the Council:

- install pedestrian crossings and road safety measures
- run a citywide bus service on Boxing and New Year's Day
- fund a Ranger post to look after local parks
- improve plans for the new youth centre on Lowfield

In the Green's Council budget this year we tried to cut the wages of top executives and instead support:

- citizens' advice centres
 - Sharrow Sure Start
 - the private sector housing standards team
- But our proposals were voted down by the ruling Labour councillors
