### **GREEN HAT-TRICK IN CENTRAL WARD**

The Green Party gained 2 new seats on Sheffield Council at the elections in May. **Sarah Jane Smalley** beat the sitting Labour Councillor by 523 votes to be the third councillor in Central Ward and **Brian Webster** took the seat of the Sheffield Liberal Democrats leader in Broomhill Ward.

Greens finished 1st or 2nd to Labour in every ward in Sheffield Central Constituency.

Next year there will be a General Election when voters from Sheffield Central will elect a Member of Parliament to represent us in London.

The Green Party gained its first MP, **Caroline Lucas**, in 2010. In 2015 we will aim to get our first northern MP here.



Cllr Smalley says "Many thanks to everyone who voted. I look forward to serving the whole community. My priorities for this year are supporting the local economy, particularly independent enterprises, including 'ground to mouth' food projects; improving our local environment by

promoting green spaces and combatting litter and pests; dealing with parking issues; working with residents, businesses and vulnerable people in the city centre to get a balance of everyone's needs; and supporting youth and community groups to give them a local voice".

# PARKING IN KELHAM ISLAND

On-street parking is a problem in Kelham Island, as commuters working in the city centre use spaces needed by visitors to local businesses and residents.

Pressure will increase as new developments come on stream, for instance the **Little Kelham** housing, the nursery and apartments on **Dun Street** and the flats and retail units on **Russell St** opposite the **Fat Cat**.

Other residential areas near the ring road have parking permit zones. Council officers have already assessed which

streets could be included. We want to hear your views and how it affects you.

#### **ACTION ON ASB**

Green Councillors supported residents and businesses opposing a second 24-hour off-licence on **West Street**. The Licensing Committee made it a condition not to sell extra-strong beer or cider, favoured by street drinkers.

We are monitoring enforcement and discussing Anti-Social Behaviour on Devonshire Green and elsewhere with police, licensing and support agencies such as the Archer Project. We inform residents of applications for late night opening, e.g. Soyo on Rockingham Street and Maida Vale on West Street. Restaurants and clubs can get Temporary Event Notices but these specify hours and sound levels. Phone 101 to report problems.

## RIVER DON OIL SPILL

On 19th July, a fire at Frogson's waste management plant caused 6,000 litres of oil to run into the River Don. **Kayak Club** volunteers worked hard to clean up the affected area but further spills have occurred since. The **Environment Agency** is responsible for identifying the source and holding polluters to account, but has not prevented severe contamination.

### SUPPORTING LOCAL BUSINESSES


We are very lucky in Central Ward to have lots of great co-operatives and other social enterprises. We are working with Creative Arts
